- The American Rescue Plan (ARP) Act passed on March 11, 2021.
- Three funding sources for schools: Elementary and Secondary Schools Emergency Relief Fund (ESSER III), US Department of Treasury's State and Local Recovery Funds (SLFRF), the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) Emergency Connectivity Fund.
- Washoe County School District received \$77,282,787 under ESSER III. Funds expire 9/30/2024. Washoe is on track to spend down all funds.
- ESSER III Set Asides from NDE Washoe received \$4,361,887 thus far.
- AB 495 \$20,590,399
- FCC Emergency Connectivity Grant \$2,000,000.
