- Core Courses GPA of 3.0, weighted includes best 3 math, best 3 science, 4 English, and 3 social studies.
- **OR**
- Advanced diploma from a Nevada high school 3.25 cumulative GPA(24 credits, 4 math, 4 English, 3 science).
- **OR**
- Test score WAIVER – ACT score of 22 composite or SAT of 1120 (reading and math only) .

APPLICATION TYPES

Common App

- Used by over 800 colleges
- Add your Incline school counselor to your application
- While you will self-report your GPA, etc., counselors will upload transcripts

College Portals

- Some schools utilize their own application portal/method outside of Common App
- Can be eligible for fee waivers

***Always review options on the school's website prior to choosing an application type*



Counselor/Teacher Recommendation Letters

College Recommendation Letter Request

- Submit request/resume to your counselor or teacher at least 2 weeks prior to your deadline.
- Recommendation information forms available in the counseling office.



Common Data Set

• What is the Common Data Set?

It is a cooperative initiative designed to ensure data shared is high quality and accurate so prospective students can compare data from school to school.



What's included in the Common Data Set?

- General Info – type of school and degrees offered
- Enrollment – % of students in various demographics who earn degrees
- First time, first year admission – info about freshmen students such as class rank, GPA, and extracurriculars in the admissions process
- Transfer admission – transfer timing, requirements, etc.
- Academic offerings
- Student life – housing, extracurriculars/activities, demographics, etc.
- Annual expense and financial aid

FAFSA: FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID

****All students must complete FAFSA to get federal aid**

- Students submit:
 - Demographic information
 - Enrollment plan information for the next year
 - Income and assets from tax returns (both parents and student) of prior-prior year
 - Opens December
 - Generates SAI – Student Aid Index
 - Gets passed along to the college or university, which is then responsible for calculating which aid programs the student qualifies for and notifying the student of their available funding for the year
 - Support Workshops – January TBD

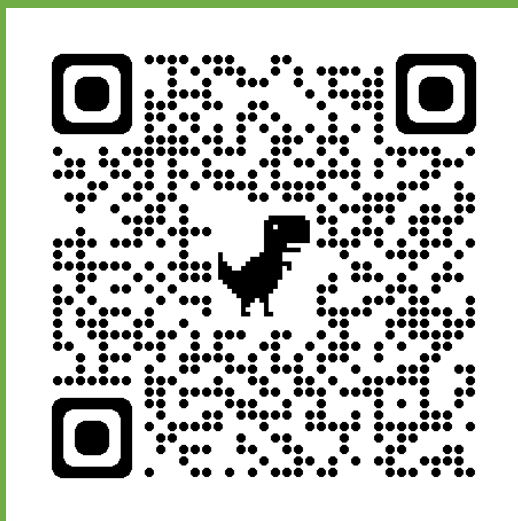

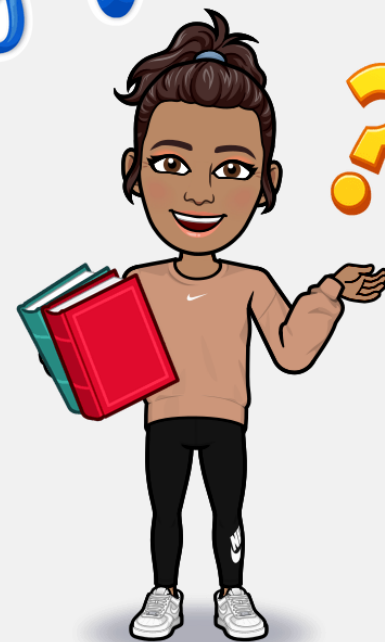
