Student Success Goal

With the District-wide implementation of i-Ready, and echoing the WCSD Strategic Plan Goal 4, Billinghurst will have 80% of the students grow by one grade level by June of 2024, as measured by the diagnostic exams in i-Ready.

To support students to achieve this goal, we will:

- 1. Create school-wide structures and routines to implement i-Ready *Pathway* time.
- 2. Use i-Ready tools to monitor student usage, progress, and growth.
- 3. Provide additional opportunities for students to utilize i-Ready tools and resources.
- 4. Pull data from Diagnostic 3 to see if we have met our goal.

Student, Staff, and Family Partnerships Goal

By the 2024 student response survey, we will see an increase in the following two prompts, as we focus on knowing every student's needs, strengths and story, and their sense of feeling connected to Billingshurst. "My teachers connect what I am doing in school to my life outside of the classroom" will increase by 5% in favorable responses, and "teacher understand my problems" will increase by 7% in favorable outcomes.

To support students and families to achieve this goal, we will:

- 1. Develop a *new student intake interview system* to provide student's name, strengths, needs, and story to their teachers.
- 2. Continue community engagement opportunities.
- 3. Provide resources from our counseling department to our families and students.
- 4. Use 2024 Student Climate Survey results to monitor growth.



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





Smarter Balanced Assessment Percent Achieving 'At or Above' Standard
