General Philosophy:

- Utilitarian Philosophy

 - Music serves a non-musical outcome.
- Aesthetic Philosophy
 - o Music's value is inside the music itself
 - Feelings-based experiences and understandings of beauty, emotion, and expression that are essential to humanity
 - High-quality musical products
- Praxial Philosophy
 - o Music is the actualization of a person's belief systems and motivations
 - Music is both a process and a product
 - o Music lives in a cultural and social context
