- All exams are given during a designated time slot that is determined by the College Board. Students should plan to arrive at least 30 minutes prior to exam start time.
- To get credit for taking the class as an AP class, you must take the AP exam. If you do not take the exam, the class will be changed to an Honors level class on your transcript. The score on the exam does not affect the student's grade in the class.
- All exams will be full length exams. Most last a little over 3 hours. Afternoon exams usually finish between 3 and 4 o'clock. There will not be transportation home for students taking afternoon exams.

- Students will be excused from their regular classes for AP exams.
- Students should plan to bring ID cards, pencils, pens (blue or black ink only) and approved calculators for classes that allow them. More information on calculators is available on the AP website at myap@collegeboard.org. CELL PHONES OR OTHER TECH DEVICES THAT CAN ACCESS THE INTERNET ARE NOT ALLOWED.
- All exams will be administered following strict sanitation guidelines to provide a safe environment for all students and proctors.
- Specific locations will be announced closer to the actual test dates; however, most exams will be held in the small gym.
