School Updates and Information

Course Preference Forms

Current 6th and 7th grade (future 7th and 8th grade) students received their course preference forms for the coming school year this morning. We ask that they bring the forms home to you to review and sign. We do this so that we are on the same page when students receive their final schedule.

We attempt to accommodate top choices. However, we are not always able achieve that goal. Given the way our schedule works and students' individual academic needs, students need to be prepared to be scheduled in one of the courses below their No. 1 choice.


Once you review your child's preferences, sign the form and return it with your student to give to your child's advisory teacher. If you have questions about the schedule, please reach out to a counselor.

TikTok Trends

We have noticed that students are using paper clips to short circuit electrical outlets and damage computer components and keyboards. Both of these activities damages school equipment. Computers need keyboards or the laptop replaced. Short circuiting electrical outlets has resulted in damage to outlets, breakers and items plugged into outlets (like refrigerators, Promethean ActivPanels and more).

We follow-up these events with both school consequences and restitution. Restitution bills can reach more than \$1,000 depending upon the severity of the damage. Replacement of classroom computers costs \$400+ with keyboards costing \$50+. We have caught students that damaged computers in each of their classes throughout the schedule.

Please have a conversation about this issue with your student and monitor social media for risk-taking behavior like this.



Uniforms and Dress Code Keep Us Focused to the End!

Our rules, routines, and procedures keep us safe and focused while we are here at school. As we near the end of the school year, there are more instances of students attempting to push the boundaries when it comes to our <u>uniform policy</u> and dress code. We wanted to let you know that we are more focused on what students are wearing because what students wear has a positive impact on their focus at school. In particular, we would like to emphasize:

- Solid colors (green, black, or white)
- Crew neck T-shirts or collared shirts (solid colors)
- Tops that extend below the waistline (no bare midriffs)
- Shorts that extend below the fingertips.
