# Read Course Descriptions to know what you are learning!


This one-year advanced level course is intended as a 3<sup>rd</sup> year science course and will cover an introduction to the structural and functional aspects of the human body. This course is for those students interested in medical fields or biological science. The course is designed to cover the structure and function of cells, tissues, organs, and an in-depth look at body systems. Demonstrations and laboratory experience, including mandatory dissections (including cats) are an integral part of the teaching of this course. Upon successful completion of Human Anatomy and Physiology, students will develop: 1) an understanding of the methods and techniques used to study the human body; 2) knowledge of the structure of all systems in the body; 3) an understanding of the functions of all the systems of the human body; 4) an understanding of the role of each body system in maintaining the homeostatic balance of the human body; 5) an awareness of relevant pathologies associated with human body systems; and 6) an awareness of the professional opportunities and requirements in the health sciences and related fields. NOTE: This class may be offered Zero period based upon enrollment numbers. The course numbers for students interested in Zero period are 3013-3014.

# **Dual Credit**

- Dual Credit allows high school students to enroll in college courses at a discounted rate. Students/families are responsible for paying fees through the college and purchasing necessary books. Financial assistance may be available through the college but is not guaranteed.
- Dual Credit classes provide a .05 bonus to their GPA & counts towards honors credits for the Honors Diploma
- Students enrolled in these courses are considered college students. This means:
  - Students has access to college offered student support services
  - · Parents/Guardians will not be able to communicate with faculty.
  - SSHS counselors and Parents/Guardians will not have access to attendance, grades, etc. for college instructor courses.

### • Credits:

- Courses worth 3-5 credits at TMCC/UNR = 1 high school credit
- Courses worth 1-2 credits at TMCC/UNR = .5 high school credit

# **Dual Credit**

### **Admission Criteria:**

- Students must show capability to take a college course
- Students must have a 3.0 GPA AND Bs in all previous semesters of specific content area
- Students must meet all college set prerequisites
  - See TMCC/UNR course descriptions

## Steps to Enroll:

- Discuss plans with SSHS Counselor
- Apply as a Non-degree seeking student (if first time taking a dual credit course @ that college)
- Complete Permission to Enroll form or other required procedures

### Fees:

- \$87.50/credit + additional fees taken with TMCC Instructor
- \$154/credit + additional fees taken with UNR Instructor
- Fees for Dual Credit courses taken with an SSHS teacher are paid for by WCSD for the 25-26 school year
- Fees subject to change, prices not guaranteed
- Most college courses are 3 credits
